The Fall Voice Conference at the University of California, San Francisco, held in conjunction with the International Association of Phonosurgery, is designed to encourage and educate professionals on a multi-disciplinary approach to the management of vocal difficulties. The focus of this three-and-a-half-day conference is the clinical care of patients with voice-related difficulties and how clinical and basic science research guide clinical care. The conference will be divided among invited lectures, panel discussions and scientific presentations. Speech language pathologists, voice teachers, voice scientists and physicians are encouraged to attend and participate.

- OBJECTIVES** Upon completion of this conference, attendees should be able to:
- Demonstrate improvement in their assessment of MTD and ability to develop a treatment plan;
  - Demonstrate knowledge of behavioral intervention techniques for voice therapy and effecting change in the speaking and singing voice;
  - Implement a multidisciplinary approach to behavioral voice treatment;

- Apply their knowledge of the physiology and clinical aspects of phonotrauma and vocal fold scar to understand treatment options;
- Identify the role of the central nervous system in voice disorders and how this may apply clinically;
- Apply recent updates in imaging and surgical techniques for laryngeal disorders;
- Demonstrate improvement in their understanding of diagnosis, management, and pathophysiology underlying peripheral nerve injury leading to vocal fold motion impairment.
